The ACT Universal Inter-School Impromptu Speech Contest 2022








FARE-THEE-WELL!


Revisiting. Reminiscing.

CULINARY CREATIONS

If you know me, you must be aware of my enthusiasm about anything Emirati. From learning the dialect, visiting, and mapping every fort and museum the country has to offer, to preparing traditional Emirati meals. The food landscape of the region is usually divided into, (ررّى /Barri) the desert cuisine, a hardy diet resulting from limited resources and vegetation the desert offered. And (بحرى BaHari) the coastal cuisine that came about due bounteous gifts of the Arabian Sea along with the trade with neighbouring nations, Emirati dishes are generously seasoned with saffron. (لومي يابس) ,cardamom dried lemon, rose wäter along with an array of spices garnished with herbs and an ample amount of ghee.

(مچبوس) Machboos

The dish originates from periods of bounty, when fish is plenty and homes are stocked with rice. Symbolising celebration, it was prepared joyously at the appearance of dhows along the coastline carrying pearls and their famished pearl divers, who had been diving to great depths to harvest them for 4 months on end. A great testament to the strength and resilience of the people in the face of adversity and struggle.

Ingredients:

- -Fish (kingfish, Modha, Hāmoor etc.) or prawns 500g
- -Rice (Sella) 500g
- -Oil/Ghee 1/2 cup
- -Onions 250g
- -Potatoes 3
- -Tomatoes 250g
- -Ginger 1tbsp
- -Garlic 1 tbsp
- Lebzār (Emirati spice blend) 2 tbsp
- -Dried lemon 2
- -Bayleaf 2
- -Cardamom 8-10
- -Cloves 3-4
- -Coriander powder 1/2 tbsp
- -Cumin powder 1/2 tbsp
- -Turmeric powder 1 tsp
- -Coriander and lemon to garnish
- -Salt to taste
